

Our council had helped set up the "Cemetery of the Innocents" in years past, but it has been a while since it had been in our area. This year's setting up of the "Cemetery of the Innocents" was actually put into motion quite a while back when my wife, Lani, started asking around about the crosses that we had seen in the area by the St John's Lutheran Church a few years ago. We came to find out that our Knights of Columbus council had been involved with the setup of those crosses so we thought that maybe we should look into doing that again. In our search for information about these crosses we found that they were actually owned and setup by a group out of Hayward who travel all around and put up this pro-life display. I made a few phone calls to the KofC council and the parish in Hayward and I was able to

find out that the person that I needed to contact was Bob Ornberg. I was able to get in contact with Bob but was disappointed to find out that they no longer had the crosses (or the custom trailer for storing and hauling the crosses and all the tools they used for the setup) because, due to health issues that Bob had suffered, they just could no longer continue this ministry anymore. They had given everything to a group in Minnesota a while back. We were very disappointed to hear this news until Bob said that there had been a time where they had reduced the number of crosses that they were setting up from 400 down to 300 due to an actual reduction in the number of abortions being performed. Bob said that when they gave the equipment to the group in Minnesota they only gave 300 of the crosses and that he still

had some of the crosses in his possession. It turned out that he still had 55 of the crosses stored at his home and he said that, if we wanted them, we could have them. We gratefully accepted his offer and Lani drove up to Hayward to get them. We now had 55 crosses but no way to set them up and no sign to explain what they were all about. Our council members quickly stepped up and volunteered to do what needed to be done so that we could get this display setup before the end of the 2018-19 school year. Jim Effertz made all of the stakes needed to setup the crosses and Dennis Wiemer made a great sign that gives passersby details about the display. On the day of the setup, it was Chuck Brady's (and his wife Laura's) help that made the setup go quickly, smoothly, and the final display look great. The OLS 8th graders did a great job cleaning the crosses, driving the stakes, and getting the display completed. I was impressed with their effort and was proud to have worked with them on this project. If you would like to see the "Cemetery of the Innocents", it is set up west of Ladysmith on Hwy 8 near Holly's Last Stand.
